The Local Elected Officials of Grundy County and the City of Trenton, as well as interested organizations and citizens appreciate this opportunity to express our support for the Transportation Earmark application submitted for financial assistance concerning the Thompson River Streambank Stabilization project. The breach to the riverbank caused a significant channel to be cut through river bottom farm ground which runs directly adjacent to Highway 6 and the Highway 6 river bridge threatening at each heavy rain event the potential for a complete washout of the channel and a closure of Highway 6 and the Thompson River bridge. Recognizing the importance of the Highway and Bridge to the commerce and emergency response to the citizenry of Grundy County, City of Trenton, and the North Central region of North Missouri, the Grundy County Industrial Development Corp., made mitigating the rivers breach a priority project for the organization and began reaching out to state and federal officials as well as the Grundy County Commission.

To date, the efforts of the Grundy County Industrial Development Corp., and the Grundy County Commission have resulted in financial commitments from NRCS and MoDOT in the following amounts:

NRCS: \$364,025.40

MoDOT: \$60,980.00


Landowners: \$10,000

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
